LIAISONS INTER NATIONALES

Comes out monthly no 4 - June 1970

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Our no 3 concrete proposals did not receive many answers. Several publications sent us a number of copies. It is obvious that those copies are merely designed to cover a possible international request, and it is unlikely that we need 100 copies for instance. On another hand we are not tradesmen and it is not neces sary to grant us bookseller's rebates: we shall take our costs no more, no less.

We did not receive any answer to our proposal of creating communications between groups having contacts in various factories. On the other hand English comrades related to Pilkington Glass strikers in St Helens had a lot of difficulties to make contact with us. Would it not be possible to create contacts following the mainstreams of capitalistic exchanges?

We received from "Cahiers du Communisme de Conseils" a letter which can be usefully published in our opinion, since it is clearly developping a widespread conception of practice. We hope this letter will be the starting point of an interesting discussion.

For material reasons, we have decided to reduce our summaries to a few articles having a more general significance; this decision implies a choice. Moreover, we are going to develop to a larger extent in the French issue texts written in other languages than French, and in the English issue, texts in another language than English.

From a friend from "CAHLERS DU COMMUNISME DE CONSEILS" (Camoin, B.P.15, 13 Marseille 12)

"Our practice itself is in the likeness of the group, very limited; it is a practice of propaganda, especially of circulation, that is to say, we circulate the "CAHIERS" as well as ICO, R.I. and other publications forwarded to us by comrades from all places. It does not mean that we believe that our work is limited within this frame, but because we are convinced that all practices are arising from a positive movement, and that the problem is not knowing what kind of action has to be undertaken in an abstract manner, but rather how could we solve concrete problems claiming our attention.

If (...) practical questions are actually bringing about divisions, it is often only because unfortunately many comrades imagine a false idea of practice.

We can't say either that ideologies do separate comrades, but rather their social nature. Of course, workers and students join in these groups. The students' difficult problem is not to see the situation any longer from an university point of view but to adopt a general historical movement position.

But this is all theory. To come back to concrete problems, I think the primary one is that of the class being brigaded by partisan and Union bureaucracies.

The team of the CAHIERS remains faithful to the opinion that only workers' conscious action through daily struggles against exploitment may bring about a revolutionary situation. Therefore, in our opinion, our primordial work is one of demystification and propaganda; our modest bulletin is clearly a small contribution to this purpose, but it has the advantage of representing a long-term work and an involvement both deeper and more complete for us, and less transitory in terms of practical implication.

It is quite clear that we are ready at any moment to make changes to our purposes in so far as our available means or the social situation itself would change.

Consequently practical action is for us, first of all, the result of a development which remains partly unknown to us and in front of which we have to act, the result and the running of such action being dependent upon the means which can be operated by us.

I think that (...) if you start a debate about the groups' activities, it will give us the picture of the various situations (social, numerical, etc) in which they are.

As for a work of communications, it is a primordial one in our opinion; in fact, in the same way as strong actions (wild-cat strikes, etc) are meaningless separately, the radical groups existing presently throughout the world can only play a specific role in their totality."

For a revolutionary grouping

Trade-unions and parties formed by the working class have been annexed by a class of "specialists". The political and union bureaucracy plays the part of a more or less disguised support of the bourgeoisie. The only solution to the problems of capitalism lies in the increasing enterprise exerted by the state machinery upon economy. Likewise the leading class

domination is brought to be more and more supported by violence only. The overthrow of capitalism is a condition to mankind survival.

No leading class has ever been threwn down from the power by something else than violence. But if a revolution must happen, new social relations have to exist before the overthrowing of the present ones, at least in embryo. Consequently, conditions for a revolution mature in so far as the proletariate succeeds in managing its own activity. It is doing so during big strikes and workers' rebellions. But in the meantime, progress is often supplanted by long flowing back.

Outside the periods of social crisis, the proletariate cannot dispose of any mass organization of its own. Therefore proletarians take part in capitalistic institutions or refuse this participation thus demonstrating an apparent apathy. The most combative elements themselves have no other alternative than being inactive or forming groupings not representative of the class. We can only consider as revolutionists those who promote the development of communist social relations by theoratically formulating proletariate's historical experience and by practically supporting its self-emancipation through practical proposals aimed to the setting up of a workers' democracy in the direction of the struggle.

The basic principle of the revolutionary organization is that the decisions must be made by all the militants without the existence of a specialized leading body.

This meeting took place in February (7, 8) in Manchester. Two mainstreams were in opposition: one wanting to base the movement upon the autonomy of the existing groups (with frequent contacts among them); to other wanting a more procise centralizing organization (with only one national paper).

It could be noticed that the discussion was trying to reach a provisory practical solution whereas between French groups such discussions generally take a political turn and a passionate aspect. Solidarity is oriented towards concrete things. Its action is characterized by informations and explanations and by the refusal of agitation; in various working groups commedes exchanged experiences with the only purpose of discussing them and coordinating their activities. The groups' activity is not limited to enterprises, but their basic aim remains the class struggle in the enterprises. For Solidarity, alienation can only be stopped by abolishing labour and exploitment.
